## WANGARATTA

With plenty to see and do within walking distance, Wangaratta makes a fantastic choice for your stay in High Country Victoria. Boasting diverse shopping, contemporary cafes, bars, galleries, arts precinct, parks and gardens as well as beautiful churches and historic buildings, each marking a piece of the rural city's history.

## GLENROWAN

Glenrowan is the site of the final siege and capture of Ned Kelly and his gang in 1880. Their story is preserved in township attractions, museums, and historic walks. Pick up a copy of the Glenrowan Heritage Siege Precinct guided touring brochure from the Vintage Hall Café to explore the town on foot. This walking map will help you navigate key Ned Kelly Gang sites of significance such as the Ann Jones' Glenrowan Inn, Police Shelter Site, Ned Kelly Capture Site and much more!

## ELDORADO

Scattered with remnants of a bygone era and nestled on the banks of Reedy Creek, Eldorado and the Woolshed Valley region remain an authentic piece of Australian history. Here, there once stood 80 hotels and four towns for gold miners. Today it is a popular place to visit for its meandering creek and falls, bush walking, bike riding and farm gates.

## KING VALLEY

The picturesque and bountiful King Valley is located at the foothills of the Alpine National Park, surrounded by mountains, rivers and rolling vineyards. Boasting some of the highest altitude vineyards in Australia, the King Valley is highly regarded for its cool-climate wines and European style varietals. Enjoy the valley views, rivers, lakes, cascading waterfalls and Prosecco Road experiences.

## MILAWA GOURMET REGION

The first official 'gourmet region' in Australia – the Milawa Gourmet Region is a food and wine epicentre. A selection of shops, cafes, and bakeries are located here, including the historic Milawa Hotel which was established in 1865.

# Embark on a Cycling Adventure

**The region offers a wide range of cycling opportunities, making it the perfect destination to explore by bike.**

You don't have to be an elite cyclist to enjoy the many tracks in and around Wangaratta. Whether it is the exhilaration of mountain bike rides, scenic bike paths or exploring our small historic towns, Wangaratta has it all within easy reach. ## ROAD RIDING

Do you prefer a leisurely ride from one winery to another? Or do you prefer to challenge yourself with hill climbs? There is no doubt that you will find a ride just right for you. The Wangaratta – Oxley Tarrawingee Loop and Lake Rowan/Taminick ride are favourites with local and visiting riders.

## MOUNTAIN BIKING

Enjoy taking your bike off the main roads and rail trails and explore the vast opportunities our national parks and state forests offer for those seeking an adventure on two wheels. The Friends Track in the Warby Ovens National Park is a popular single track, boasting alpine vistas and exciting rock gardens.

## MURRAY TO MOUNTAINS RAIL TRAIL

Weaving over 100 kilometres through the historic townships of Wangaratta, Beechworth, Rutherglen and Bright, there are secrets to be discovered that you won't see from any car including hidden valleys, unspoilt bushland and open farmland. If you would prefer someone to plan the adventure for you, there are a number of tour operators specialising in personalised bike tours and provide all the equipment you require.

## GRAVEL RIDING

The King Valley is a gravel riding dream, filled with roads and tracks begging to be explored. With trailheads in Moyhu and Whitfield, King Valley Gravel and Ride High Country have created eight routes for all levels of gravel cycling, from shorter, flatter routes to challenging long hauls with epic climbs and descents.

Other options include Chiltern Mount Pilot National Park's Woolshed Falls Gravel Ride, with multiple river crossings leading to spectacular waterfalls. Or perhaps discover Warby Ovens National Park where you will be rewarded with beautiful vistas and iconic Grasstrees on tracks that are mostly closed to public vehicles.

# The Great Outdoors

**Wangaratta is known as the gateway to Victoria's High Country, offering easy access to spectacular state and national parks, including the Warby-Ovens National Park and the Wabonga Plateau in the Alpine National Park.**

The spectacular Victorian Alps, picturesque valleys surrounded by National Parks, stunning lakes and vast waterways make Wangaratta the perfect place to base yourself for your ultimate outdoor holiday. With a community passionate about the great outdoors, there's plenty of shops within Wangaratta stocking everything you could need for your next camping, hunting, fishing or cycling trip – or even just that one item you forgot to pack!

## NATURAL ADVENTURES

Get the heart racing and get your kicks with plenty of high energy activities like white-water rafting, kayaking, horse riding, off and on road biking, four-wheel driving, hot air ballooning or hiking the mountains and valleys. Discover breathtaking views, spectacular rock formations and cascading waterfalls. There is no shortage of experiences to ensure your holiday is a memorable one.

## RIVERS AND LAKES

Discover the pristine waterways and wild ravines by canoe, kayak or raft. Grab your oars and canoe or kayak around Lake William Hovell or paddle one of the more challenging stretches of the King River. With over 40 sets of rapids the King River offers grade 2 to grade 4 white water. Be aware that high water levels can lead to high rapids which should only be tackled by experienced paddlers.

Explore the tranquil waters of the Ovens River on a self-guided tour. There are a number of popular sandy beaches a short stroll from Wangaratta's CBD. Other swimming spots include the Ovens River, King River, Top Cut Dam and Lake William Hovell.

## FISHING

Try your hand at fishing in one of the many rivers, mountain streams and lakes. The locals are always keen to share with you the story of their latest catch and the best spots to try.

## CAMPING

There are a number of camping spots and caravan parks located throughout the municipality to suit any taste. Everything from glamping in style with all the creature comforts of home to bush camping in our National Parks and reserves.



## Bushwalking

Grab your hiking boots and explore some of Victoria's most ruggedly beautiful walking tracks. The Warby-Ovens and Alpine National Parks offer a number of walks and hikes for sightseers and experienced hikers alike.

Just two of our many sightseeing walks to include in your visit are:

- Mount Glenrowan – 9km return. Easy to moderate grade with impressive views across the Glenrowan township and majestic alpine valleys.
- Mount Cobbler (pictured) – 10km, 3.5 hours return. Grade is easy and the views are simply amazing.

## GOLF COURSES

Take in a relaxed 18 holes in Wangaratta with the choice of two golf clubs, Wangaratta Golf Club and Jubilee Golf Club, which is frequently visited by kangaroos. Golfing can also be enjoyed at Tarrawingee, Whitfield and Boorhaman.

## PARKS & GARDENS

Wangaratta is surrounded by parkland and tranquil natural bushland. Enjoy and relax with a summer picnic in King George V Gardens or enjoy a hit of tennis in the beautiful Merriwa Park, surrounded by lush gardens. Apex Park is close to town with free showers, a playground and all day parking.

## BIRD WATCHING

Twitchers can enjoy exploring the national parks and rivers which are home to a variety of woodland birds such as the Turquoise Parrot, Hooded Robin and the Speckled Warbler.

## FOUR WHEEL DRIVING

A short drive from Whitfield, there are excellent four wheel drive tracks in the Alpine National Park. Popular sites include Mount Cobbler, Sandy Flat, Top Crossing Hut, The Razorback, Lake Cobbler and Mount Speculation. Park notes available at [parks.vic.gov.au](http://parks.vic.gov.au) and maps are available at Wangaratta Visitor Information Centre.

## MOUNTAINS & VALLEYS

Standing from a lookout vantage point over the rolling hills below, you will be amazed by the sheer beauty and the seemingly untouched natural surrounds. Take your pack and venture into the depths of the Alpine National Park, camping under the wide open starry skies and wake to the crisp fresh mountain air. Or stay in a nearby accommodation venue, take in a hearty home-cooked breakfast before donning your walking shoes to discover one of the many walks and trails.

- Dandongadale Falls, Victoria's highest waterfalls rising above the Cobbler Plateau with a 255m drop.
- Paradise Falls (seasonal) is easily accessible by 2WD along a well maintained gravel road. There is a dirt track leading to the bottom of the falls to a viewing platform. There are picnic tables near the car park.
- Power's Lookout offers an excellent vantage point and was once the haunt of the 'Gentleman Bushranger' Harry Power. From the main road is a 3kilometre trip along a gravel road to reach the lookout that offers spectacular views over the Wabonga Plateau and Mount Cobbler. There are picnic tables at the lookout.

## ELDORADO & THE WOOLSHED VALLEY

The Woolshed Valley once boasted 80 hotels and four towns, with Eldorado being one of the most colourful of these towns, housing over 6,000 miners. Today it is a popular place to visit for its meandering creek and falls, bush walking and bike riding. Chiltern Mt Pilot National Park, Monument Hill Lookout and Reedy Creek are all places to discover natural beauty, wildlife and scenery.

- Try gold panning and gem fossicking. (Miners License required and available from the Wangaratta Visitor Information Centre)
- Journey along The Woolshed Valley Self- Guided Drive and read the stories of gold and bushrangers.

## GLENROWAN

A region steeped in history and unique beauty – the Warby-Ovens National Park offers a completely unique experience. Ride your road bike over the Taminick Gap or get off road for challenging mountain bike trails. North of Glenrowan in the Warby-Ovens National Park, discover a number of rewarding lookouts, easy bush walks, bird watching and picnic areas.

- For the best view of the Ovens and King Valleys, and the Victorian Alps, head to Mount Glenrowan Lookout off Taminick Gap Road.
- Explore Ryan's Lookout, Pine Gully and Salisbury Falls.

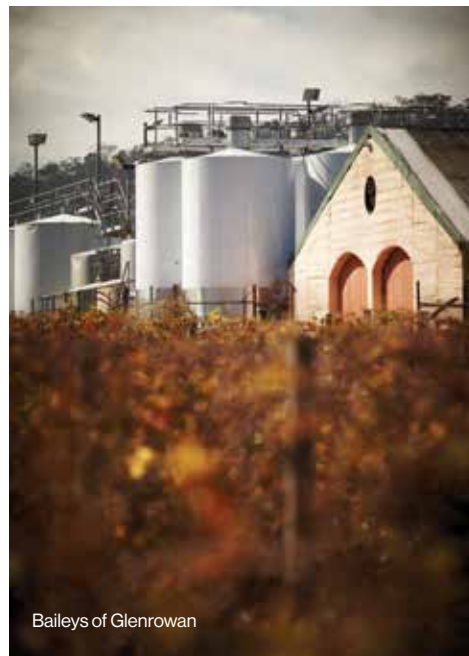
## GLENROWAN

Around the time Ned Kelly was on the way to becoming infamous in the Glenrowan region, folklore has it that he was assisting the Bailey family to plant their first vines as a fencing contractor. The ensuing 130 years of wine growing have established Glenrowan’s reputation for full bodied reds, particularly Shiraz, fragrant whites and deliciously

renowned fortified wines. The wines of Glenrowan remain robust, with modern ways adding sophistication. This wine region’s cellar doors are intimate, historic and welcoming.

## ELDORADO & BEECHWORTH

These small scale wineries at the foothills of the Victorian Alps are definitely worth a visit to sip, sample and savour drops from what is most likely a family run business. Eldorado and Beechworth are both former gold mining towns that through architecture, cobblestones and clever storytelling throughout the areas still pay homage to the time they housed thousands of miners. Top varieties include Chardonnay, Pinot Noir and Shiraz.

## BULLAWAH CULTURAL TRAIL

Wander through a series of interpretive signs, sculptures, a Bush Tucker Garden and Marmungan Rock where you will learn about the traditional owners of the land.

The trail has been developed to celebrate, share and record the Aboriginal cultural heritage of the area, which is spiritually significant and rich in history. The name Bullawah, from bulla – meaning two and wah – meaning water signifies the two suspension bridges crossing the river as well as the joining of the two rivers the Ovens (Torryong) and King (Poodumbia) and the coming together of Aboriginal and non-aboriginal people.

## NED KELLY TOURING ROUTE

Explore the many pieces of the Kelly Gang story visiting the various Kelly sites throughout Melbourne, North East Victoria and Southern New South Wales on the Ned Kelly Touring Route.

Bushrangers frequented the area back in the day with Harry Power, Dan Morgan and the infamous Ned Kelly Gang roaming the hills and ranges surrounding Wangaratta and the King Valley.

From the gallows at the Old Melbourne Gaol, to the spectacular views from Powers Lookout in the King Valley and the broad plains of Jerilderie, visit as many or few sites as time and interest allows.

The gateway to Victoria's High Country, Wangaratta is located just off the Hume Freeway, 2.5 hours North of Melbourne and 45 minutes south of Albury-Wodonga. There is plenty to see and do with art, culture and history flowing through the township. Fabulous food and drink await, with options to suit any occasion. Tracks and trails are abundant with cycling paths connecting the CBD and surrounding townships.

## SHOP

Wander the streets and immerse yourself in the CBD retail shops offering individual character, charm and country hospitality. The main shopping streets are Murphy, Reid, Ovens and Ford Streets, all of which are filled with a mix of department stores and boutique shops offering everything from high end fashion and homewares to gifts and electrical goods.

The township of Glenrowan includes the site of the final siege and capture of Ned Kelly and demise of his gang in 1880. Their story is preserved in the townships attractions, museums, historic walks as well as a six metre statue of Ned in the centre of the town. Mature vineyards producing award winning wines, a terrific foodie scene and bush walks with stunning panoramic views will all ensure a visit to Glenrowan exceeds your expectations.

## EXPLORE

Sweeping views from the Warby-Ovens National Park southward to the Victorian Alps makes for picturesque picnics, cycling, road touring and bushwalking. A short drive away is the expansive Winton Wetlands. Seek out vantage points and lookouts including Ryan's Lookout, Mount Glenrowan and Salisbury Falls (flowing after periods of rainfall). Adjoining Booth's Taminick Cellars and the Black Dog Brewery is the Warby Heritage Falls Trail which leads up to a seasonal waterfall.

When you finish head back to the cellar for a refreshing beverage. Collectible treasures from the past, souvenirs of Glenrowan or tasteful locally created craftwork can be found in Glenrowan. Relive and learn about Glenrowan's unique history through the museums, animated theatre and self-guided walks.

Scattered with remnants of a bygone era and nestled on the banks of Reedy Creek at the foot of the Woolshed Valley stands Eldorado. The discovery of gold played a monumental part in securing the town's historical significance, whilst the adjoining Woolshed Valley was pivotal in the legend of the Ned Kelly Gang.

## EXPLORE

While the miners' dwellings are long gone, the school museum, dredge, cemetery and several churches still stand and provide an insight into life as it was in a bygone era. Try your hand at gold panning or fossicking for gemstones along the Woolshed Valley. Eldorado's shared path is perfect for walking and cycling, traversing the entire length of the town from the Eldorado Museum to the historic gold and tin mining dredge.

Visit Eldorado Pottery, the Museum, Art Studio/Galleries, farm gate outlets when in season and Eldorado's three historic churches.

## HISTORY

The name Eldorado came long before gold was discovered. In 1841, Captain William Fury Baker a settler and previously a Royal Navy Captain, renamed his Barambogie property, near Chiltern, "El Dorado". Although much of the original architecture is long gone today you can visit the Eldorado Museum to discover a time of mining legends, gold boom and bust, pioneers, farming heritage and the colourful folk law characters – heroes, villains and outlaws. View a replica of Joe Byrne's armour and other Kelly artefacts.

Although Eldorado's main gold extraction was through open-cut methods, the gold discovered in the river flats wasn't as easily accessible. In 1936 production of Cock's large bucket dredge began, mining alluvial gold and tin until 1954. It remains a formidable sight and graphically illustrates the extent of the mining operation.

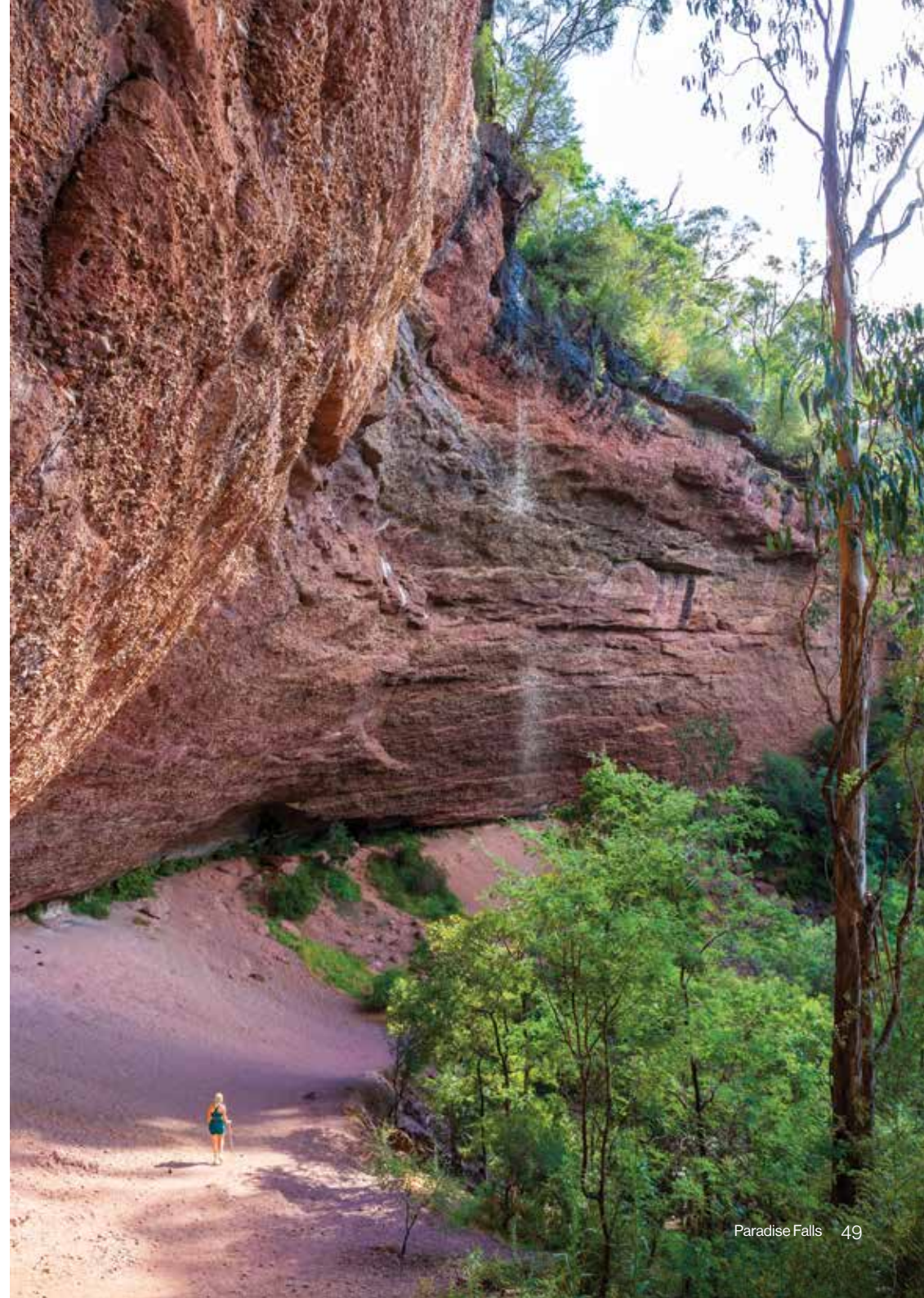

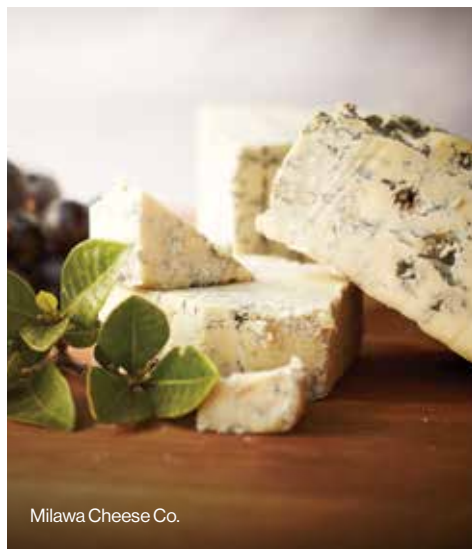

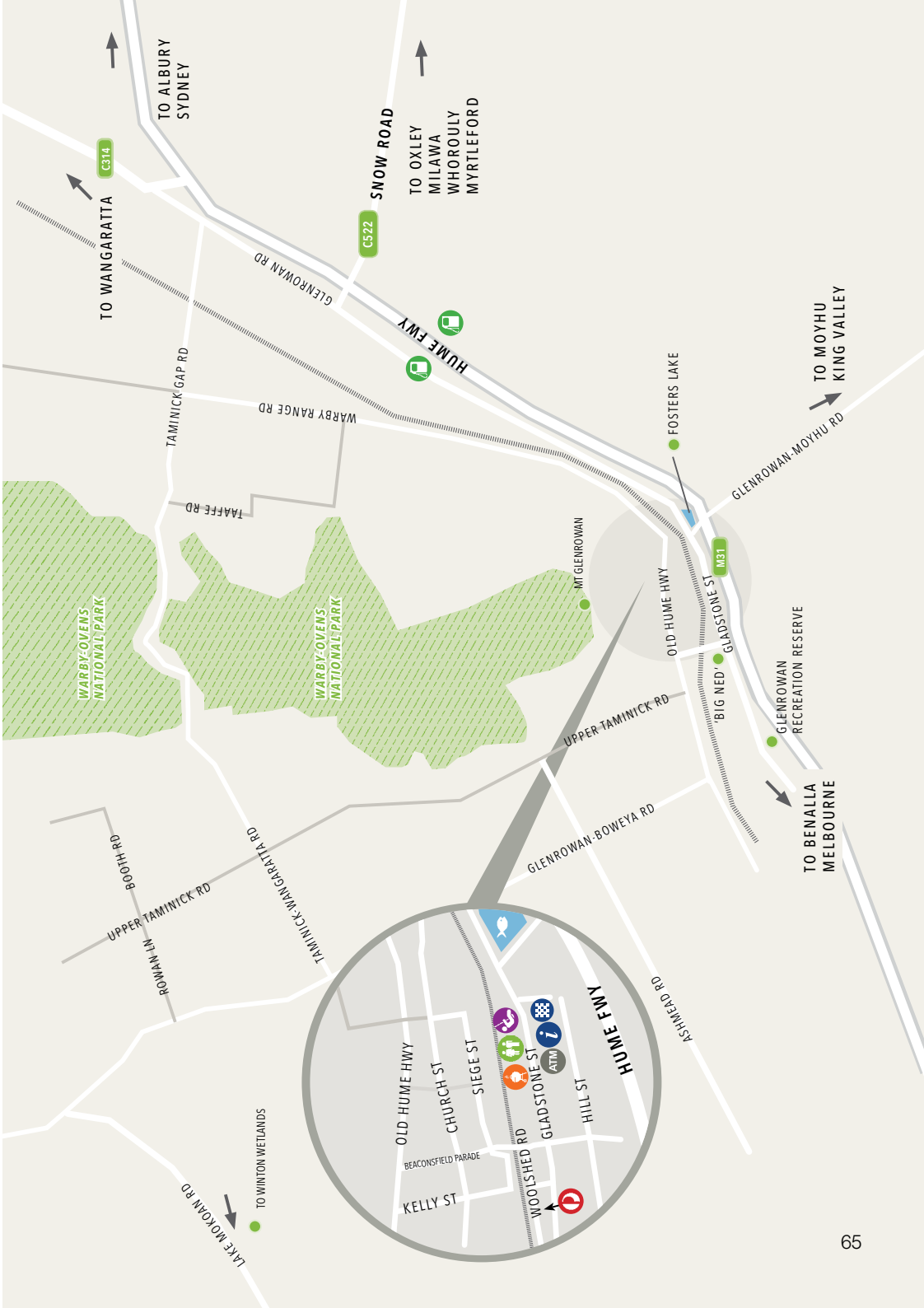
# Glenrowan

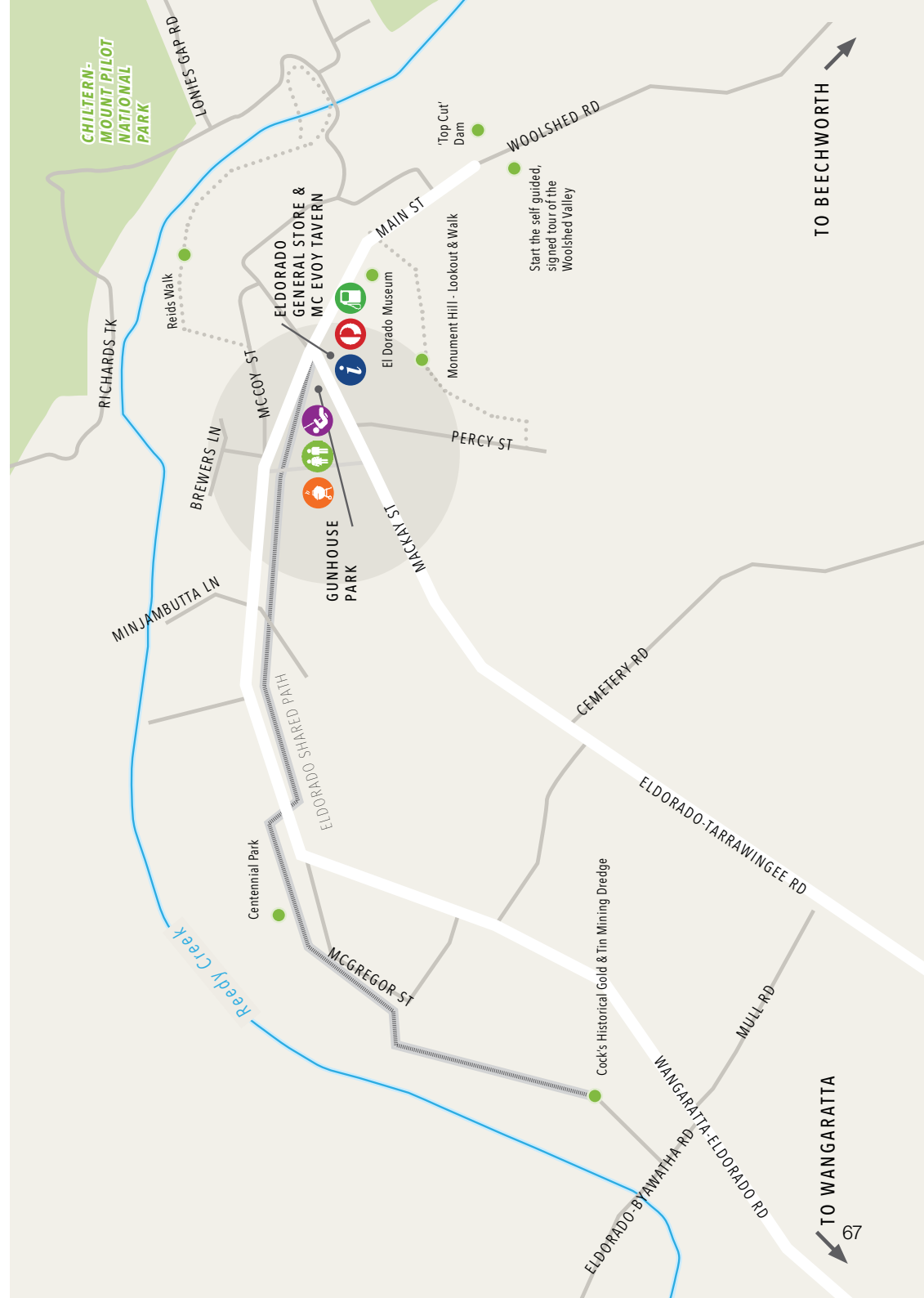

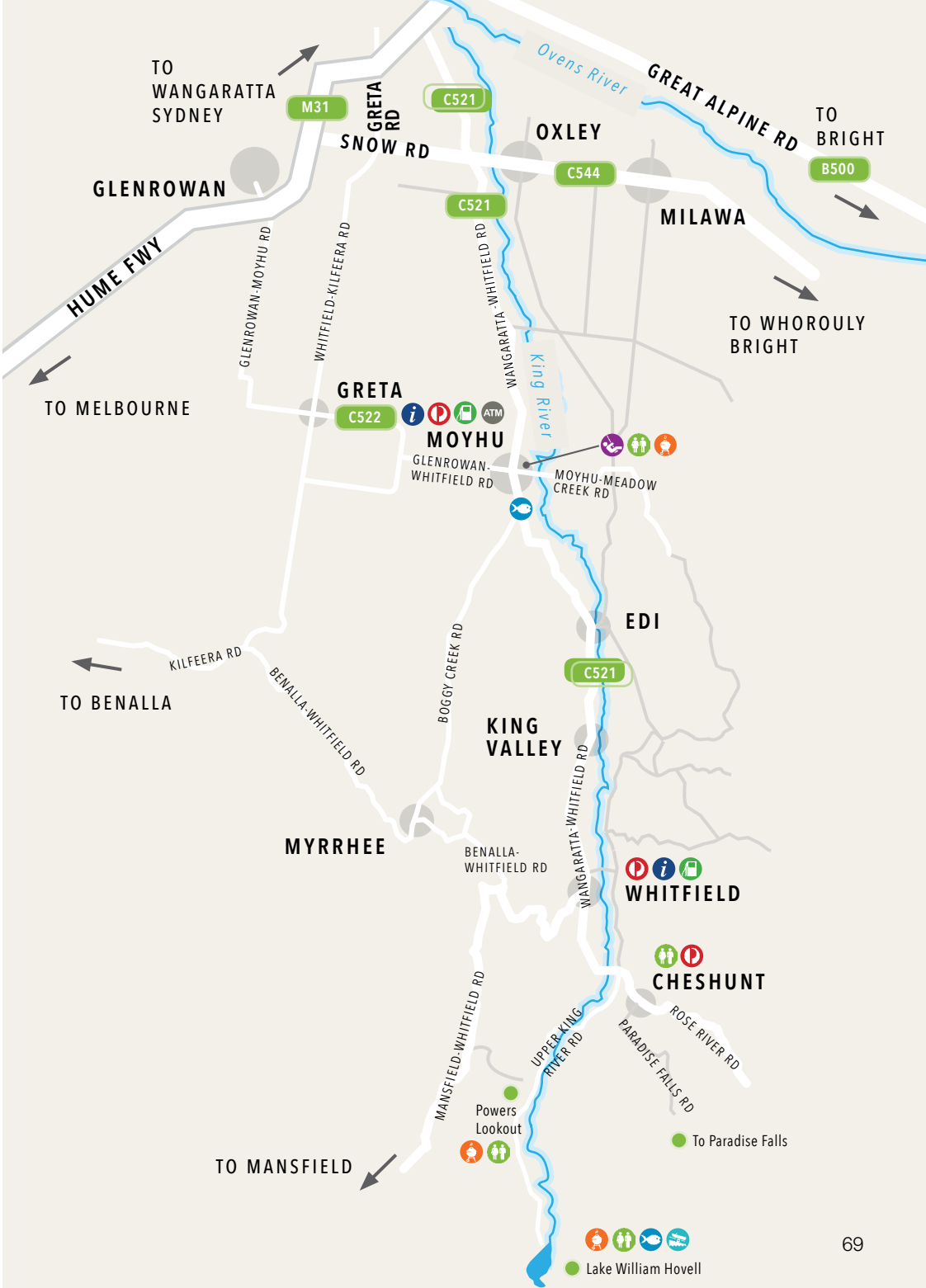
# King Valley

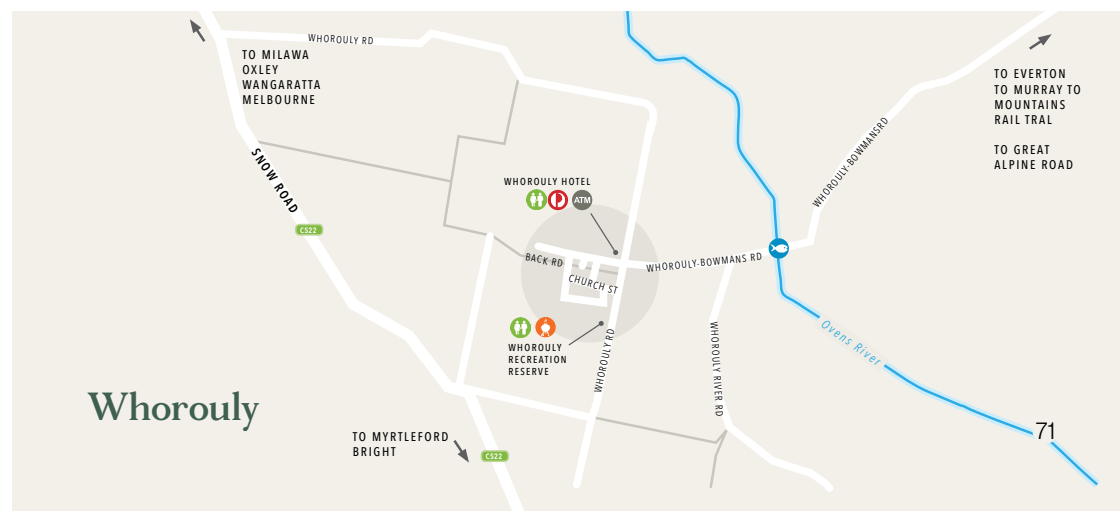
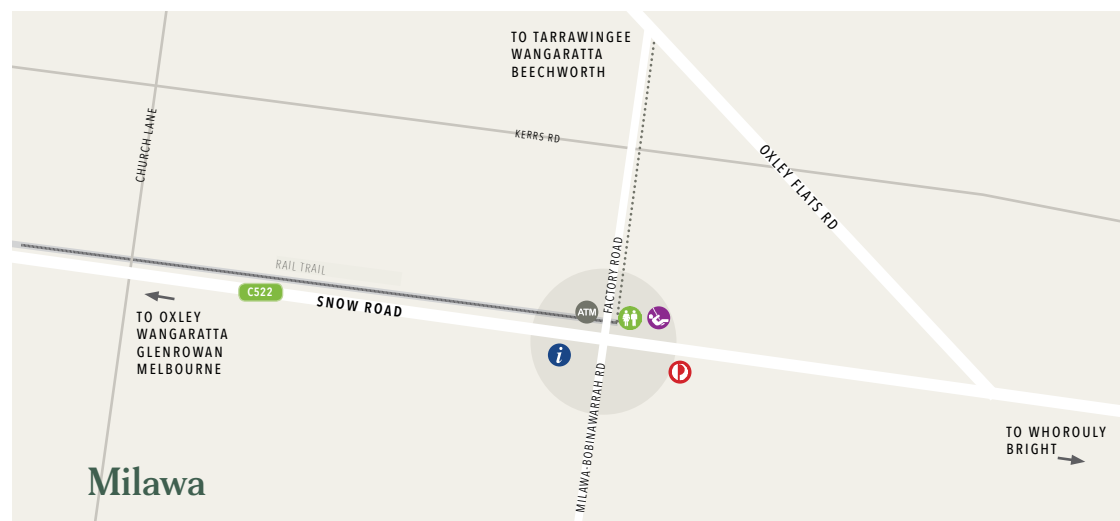
